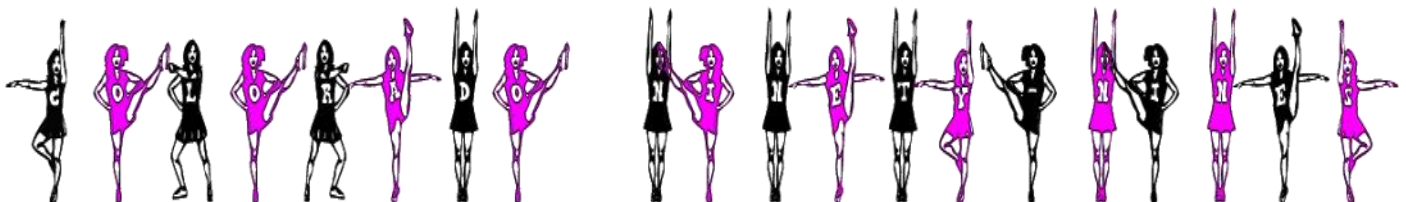

# Attention Student Pilots!

The deadline for the spring First Wings Award is **April 1**.

You may be eligible for an award of up to **\$6,000** if you meet the following criteria:

- You are a current student pilot.
- You have been a member of the 99s since on or before January 1, 2026.  
You have logged at least five hours of flight training in the six months immediately preceding the April 1 application deadline.

An updated application form will be available on the international website on or about February 1.

### **Tips for a Successful Application:**

- **Read all instructions carefully!** This includes the general FIRST WINGS Award Instructions AND the application form instructions.
- **Follow all instructions precisely.** If bullet points are provided in the instructions, ensure you address those points at a minimum; providing a little extra detail is also acceptable.
- **Download the application before entering any information.** The online form does not save your progress.
- You need a mentor (any 99s member can assist you). Contact **Jane Link** if you need help finding one.
- The Colorado Chapter is part of the **South Central Section**.
- Necessary documents can be captured with a phone or scanner. Ensure they are complete, clean, **readable**, and as straight as possible.
- The 99s Recommendation and Certification pages (Part VII and VIII) will be completed by the Chapter AEMSFS scholarship chairman, Jane Link, *after* you submit your application to her on April 1

Email your complete application to the Chapter AEMSFS chairman, Jane Link, no later than **April 1**.

# Future Women Pilot Award

The Colorado 99s is excited to announce the upcoming opening to apply for the 2026 Future Women Pilot Award .

The application for the **2026 Future Woman Pilot Award** scholarship will open March 1 with a deadline of April 30.

The award is for flights and flight instruction in any aircraft type (airplane, glider, hot air balloon, etc.) as appropriate for the certificate.

- To Be Eligible, each applicant must:
- Be female
- Undergo flight training in Colorado
- Currently hold a Student Pilot Certificate (if required for the certificate sought)
- Have logged at least 5 hours of flight time in the six months preceding the application deadline

# 49th Air Race Classic



[The Air Race Classic](#) stands as the premier event in women's cross-country air racing. Competitors span generations—some just 17, others well into their nineties—and represent an impressive mix of backgrounds: students, educators, medical professionals, airline pilots, entrepreneurs, and even air traffic controllers.

Each team is made up of at least two women pilots who must fly VFR, limited to daylight hours, and complete flybys at every designated timing point before reaching the final stop. The course shifts annually, stretching roughly 2,400 statute miles and typically featuring eight or nine timing locations along the way.

For 2026, the race will run from June 23 through June 26.

# A Colorado CFI's Advice: Navigating the Skies with The 99s

It's winter! And even though this has been an oddly dry winter, it's getting cold outside! You all know what that means; it's time for every pilot's worst nightmare, frosty airplanes!

Frost and ice are major concerns for pilots of all aircraft types. Under 14 CFR § 91.527, no pilot may take off with frost, ice, or snow adhering to any propeller, windshield, stabilizing or control surface; to a powerplant installation; or to an airspeed, altimeter, rate of climb, or flight attitude instrument system or wing - in other words, almost the entire airplane!! As pilots, we should know this. But let's get into why.



In the last 10 years, there have been over 30 accidents during the takeoff roll from wing contamination due to ice. When frost or snow accumulates on the wings and other control surfaces, the smooth flow of airflow necessary to make us fly is disrupted. This can lead to increased stall speeds, longer takeoff rolls, or even an inability to become airborne at all. Ice can also lead to blockages in your pitot-static system causing false instrument readings. On top of that, ice adds increased weight and can create uneven weight distribution, leading to handling problems and rolling tendencies. None of those outcomes are ideal, and are entirely preventable! So, what are your

options? In simple terms: go home, or get it off!

Now that I have moved into jets I have a new appreciation for those early and cold mornings out on the flight school ramp with a snow-broom, hot water bag, and rags, and praying that I'd get put in the hangar for the next day. Those sucked! But, it's always worth it for safe flying. Many flight schools incorporate methods of snow removal that are easily accessible, although they are often not ideal. Nowadays most flight schools have some form of de-icing fluid. Most commonly glycol or polypropylene antifreeze. These de-icers work by lowering the freezing temperature of water, allowing the water to melt at a cooler temperature. However, these are not to be used as anti-ice equipment, they are very effective as de-ice equipment and help ease some of the pain of scraping the ice off yourself.

In my jet, I got to experience de-icing for the first time! It was cool to be sitting in the airplane while getting sprayed, it felt like a luxury. As a brief explanation, there are four types of de-icing fluids all used for different purposes. Type one is the least extreme and is primarily used to remove contamination, while Type IV is the most extreme and is used if there is active precipitation threatening a safe takeoff roll.



Below is a small chart to help briefly explain further!

| Type | Purpose  | Thickness  | Typical Aircraft       |
|------|----------|------------|------------------------|
| I    | De-ice   | Thin       | All                    |
| II   | Anti-ice | Thick      | Fast jets              |
| III  | Anti-ice | Medium     | Turboprops / regionals |
| IV   | Anti-ice | Very thick | Large jets             |

As a last wrap up, please remember that even the smallest bit of ice on the airplane can interfere with the safe operation of flight. When in doubt, always take the time to remove the ice fully before attempting to fly. Safe flying and stay warm!

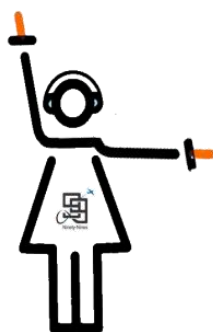


# Going Shopping

- 5) Sport your spiffy new gear at our next event!



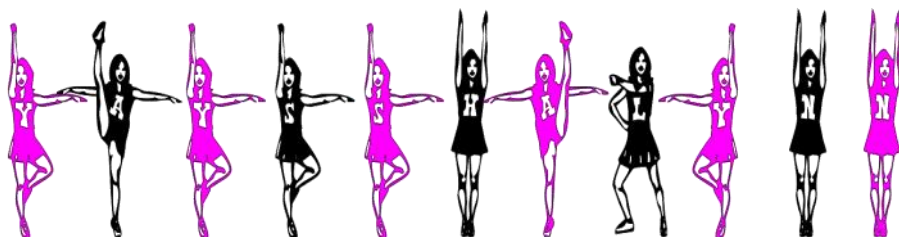


# Congratulations Shalynn



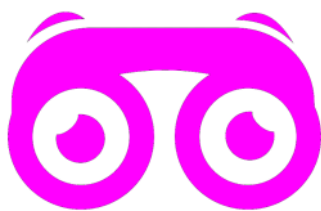
Shalynn Swails
