

AOPA

The Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA), has published a video series that aims to provide companion passen-

gers resources to learn and prepare to enjoy active participation in flight. Five separate videos, each between 5 and 7 minutes, offer an informative and positive experience that results in enhanced knowledge, awareness, and potential for enjoyment of flight. Video 1, titled 'Preflight' includes an overview of planning and go/no-go considerations. Video 2 - Aviate - reviews fundamentals of flight and mechanical systems. Video 3 - Navigate - delves into charts and route planning. Video 4 - Communicate - focuses on radio communication and interaction with ATC. Finally, Video #5 touches on emergency procedures and responses, and incorporates learning from prior videos. During each video, theoretical concepts are reviewed, and practical tips are given to enhance the competence and confidence of passengers. Perhaps this learning adventure would also be of interest to a potential future pilot? It can be such a delight to introduce the wonders of flight to companion passengers. Election of Officers

Every two years, the Chapter elects a new board of directors. Nominations are due in April, elections occur at the May meeting, and leaders begin their two-year term in June. Here is a snapshot of the leadership roles with voting privileges that keep our chapter active:

Chairman - Organizes and oversees all Chapter activities. Presides over meetings and serves on each working committee.

Vice-Chairman - Assists the Chairman and performs the duties of the Chairman in her absence. Also assists each of the Committee Chairmen.

Secretary - Records the minutes of each business meeting.

Treasurer - Responsible for all the organization's financial accounts.

Directors - Recruit candidates for officer positions (Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary and two Directors), and coordinate the summer picnic and holiday party.

And then there are the various Committee Chairs, who are vitally important to our Chapter's education and outreach efforts:

Airmarking Chairman - Coordinates with an airport manager to paint The 99s compass rose or the name of the airport on the ramp or a taxiway.

Archivist - Maintains Chapter history items and scrapbooks.

Flying Activities Chairman - Coordinates the Chapter's fly out event. This 'position' has been managed by the Program Chairman for the past few years.

Membership Chairman - Responsible for promoting Chapter membership through recruiting and retaining members.

News Reporter - Writes up Chapter activities to report in 99s publications.

Newsletter Editor – Produces and distributes the *Crosswind Chatter*, our monthly newsletter.

Program Chairman - Organizes speakers and activities for the monthly meeting of the members.

Scholarship Chairman - Coordinates The 99s International scholarship programs (Amelia Earhart and First Wings Awards) and assists applicants.

Chapter Scholarship Chairman - Coordinates the Chapter scholarship programs and assists applicants.

Website & Social Media Chairman - Manages and coordinates the Chapter's public presence on the internet. She may also serve as the Webmaster.

Youth Outreach Chairman - Coordinates programs designed to introduce youth to aviation.

That's a **LOT** of talent that goes into running our monthly and annual activities! While not every position is up for election each cycle, we always welcome new energy, so please let us know where you'd like to help out.

Attention Student Pilots!


The fall First Wings Award deadline is 1 October. If you are a student pilot who has been a member of The 99s since on or before 1 July 2023, and have logged at least five hours of flight training in the six months prior to the application deadline of October 1, you may qualify for an award of up to \$6000. If you are preparing to apply here are some tips:

- Go to the international website and under the 'Resources' menu, 'Webinars' selection, find and watch the webinar: "AEMSF Scholarships - Tips for Strengthening Your Application (11/4/2020)". The video pro vides necessary tips to help you create a winning award application. Link: https://www.ninety-nines.org/webinars.htm
- Download the application before filling any fields the online form does not save any information you enter. Read the instructions carefully. Where bullet points are part of the instructions, be sure to cover those points at minimum a little bit extra will be fine too.
- If you need a mentor (any 99s member can help you!), contact Jane Link to help you find one.
- The 99s Recommendation and Certification pages (Part VII and VIII) are completed by the Chapter scholarship chairman, Jane Link, after the application is submitted.
- The Colorado Chapter is in the South Central Section.
- Necessary documents may be captured on a phone or scanner, but make sure they are complete, clean, readable and straight as possible.
- Email your application to the Chapter AEMFS chairman, Jane Link no later than **1 October**.
