



### Scholarship Opportunity


## The Ruehle Award for Advanced Flight Training

Available through the Colorado Chapter of Ninety-Nines, International Organization of Women Pilots.

Two \$5000 Scholarships for Colorado women pilots pursuing advanced flight ratings

#### **Eligibility Critera:**

- Female undergoing flight instruction in Colorado.
- Minimum of a FAA Certified Private Pilot.
- Must be applying for an FAA Advanced Rating (Commercial, IFR, CFI, CFII, Multi-engine, Glider, Lighter-Than-Air, ATP, etc.)
- · Demonstrated financial need for Award.
- Must have a current, valid FAA Medical Certificate appropriate for the pilot certificate being sought.
- Currency: minimum of five hours in the six months preceding the application submission deadline.

The Colorado Chapter of Ninety-Nines is pleased to announce a new scholarship award beginning this year. The Ruehle Award for Advanced Ratings will award **two** women **\$5,000 each** to pursue an advanced aviation rating such as instrument, commercial, multi-engine, etc.

Jane Ruehle is a longtime member of the Colorado Chapter of Ninety-Nines. Her late husband Walt enjoyed a long career as an aviator, and took pride in telling everyone that his most important job was to help Jane get her airplanes in and out of the hangar.

The Ruehle Award is made possible by Jane's generous contribution to the Colorado Ninety-Nines, in honor and memory of Walt. The intent of the award is to help Colorado women pilots earn an advanced rating to further their aviation careers and goals.

#### **Attention Student Pilots!**


The fall First Wings Award deadline is 1 October. If you are a student pilot who has been a member of The 99s since on or before 1 July 2023, and have logged at least five hours of flight training in the six months prior to the application deadline of October 1, you may qualify for an award of up to \$6000. If you are preparing to apply here are some tips:

- Go to the international website and under the 'Resources' menu, 'Webinars' selection, find and watch the webinar: "AEMSF Scholarships - Tips for Strengthening Your Application (11/4/2020)". - Download the application before filling any fields the online form does not save any information you enter. Read the instructions carefully. Where bullet points are part of the instructions, be sure to cover those points at minimum a little bit extra will be fine too.
- If you need a mentor (any 99s member can help you!), contact Jane Link to help you find one.
- The 99s Recommendation and Certification pages (Part VII and VIII) are completed by the Chapter scholarship chairman, Jane Link, after the application is submitted.
- The Colorado Chapter is in the South Central Section.
- Necessary documents may be captured on a phone or scanner, but make sure they are complete, clean, readable and straight as possible.
- Email your application to the Chapter AEMFS chairman, Jane Link no later than 1 October.
